### Deialog

Ffred: **Licwn i w(y)bod un peth.**

Sandra: **Beth yw hynny?**

Ffred: **Pryd (wyt) ti'n meddwl bydda i'n rhugl?**

Sandra: **Mae hynny'n dibynnu.**

Ffred: **Fyddet ti'n dweud mod i'n gwella?**

Sandra: **Byddwn, wrth gwrs. O'r wythnos nesa ymlaen, fydd dim rhaid i ni siarad Saesneg â'n gilydd.**

Ffred: **Gobeithio dy fod ti'n iawn.**

Sandra: **(D)w i'n siŵr mod i.**

rhugl	- fluent

ein gilydd	- each other (us)

### **Pwyntiau i'w cofio:**

1. Remember to use 'yn' ('n after a vowel) as a link, between a 'bod' verb form and an infinitive (verb-noun), e.g. 'Dw i'n mynd' 'Mae e'n gwybod' 'Bydd Tom yn ateb' 'Ro'n i'n dod' 'Bydden ni'n deall'. With simple verb forms 'yn' isn't needed, but remember the TM, e.g. 'Geith e fynd?', 'Licwn i\_wybod', 'Dylwn i **ddeall**', 'Alla i **ddod**'
2. As with other forms of the conditional, 'lico' is characterised by the vowel 'e' in casual speech:

Licen i	I would like
Licet ti	You would like (fam.)
Lice fe / hi	He / she would like
Licen ni	We would like
Licech chi	You would like
Licen nhw	They would like
Lice'r plant	The children would like
