Ffred: **Yn dy fag di (r)o'n nhw.**
Sandra: **Nage. Welais i (ddi)m ohonyn nhw ar ôl dydd Sul.**
Ffred: **Ond paciaist ti'r tocynnau yn dy fag di.**
Sandra: **Do. Ond do'n i ddim wedi rhoi'r pasports i mewn.**
Ffred: (Wyt) **ti'n hollol siŵr?**
Sandra: **Ydw. Rhaid i ni droi yn ôl neu awn ni ddim pellach na Heathrow.**
Ffred: **Lwcus ein bod ni wedi sylweddoli mewn pryd.**
Sandra: **Ie, neu byddet ti yn y cawl.**

Pwyntiau i'w cofio:

1. The word 'o', meaning 'of', can be used in 'rhai o'r plant' and 'rhan o'r ffilm', but if a pronoun takes the place of 'plant' or 'ffilm' then 'o' itself changes depending on the person. Here is how 'o' is conjugated:

POSITIVE

ohona i	of me
ohonot ti	of you (fam.)
ohono fe / ohoni hi	of him / her
ohonon ni	of us
ohonoch chi	of chi
ohonyn nhw	of them
o'r plant	of the children

NEGATIVE

(ddi)m ohona i
(ddi)m ohonot ti
(ddi)m ohono fe / ohoni hi
(ddi)m ohonon ni
(ddi)m ohonoch chi
(ddi)m ohonyn nhw
(ddi)m o'r plant

2. 'Ddim o' (frequently contracted to **mo**) is used when the object of the simple verb is definite, e.g. *Welais i (ddi)m o'r ffilm.* 'I didn't see the film' (Lit: I saw nothing of the film).
